Instructions and Important Information - Complete this *Mayflower Lineage Match* form provided by the General Society of Mayflower Descendants. Fill it out beginning with the name of your Pilgrim ancestor. On the next line, enter his/her son or daughter, and who they married. Then list the next son or daughter and their spouse. Continue through the generations down to yourself. We will compare your proposed lineage with the applications in our files to determine what portion of your line has already been documented. You will receive an emailed report on the findings, along with instructions on how to proceed with membership. Please expect to wait four to eight weeks for your response.

Quick Start to Florida Mayflower Society Membership

First Things First!

Fill out the attached Mayflower Lineage Match Form and return it to a State Co-Historian, or State Historian. Be sure to include all of your contact information as this form will be used to create your application.

What Does It Cost?

There are two application fees. The first application fee you will be required to pay is \$40.00 made payable to FSMD (Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of Florida). This fee is given to a State Co-Historian or State Historian *before* your application can begin. It is non-refundable and is valid for 24-months.

The second application fee you will be required to pay is \$150.00* -- also made payable to FSMD. It is due at the time your application goes to GSMD (The General Society of Mayflower Descendants) for verification/approval and is a non-refundable fee. Upon acceptance by both FSMD and GSMD, you will be required to pay \$54.00 dues to the Colony in which you are now a member. *NOTE: check with the Colony Historian as some Colonies require dues to be paid at the time the application goes to Plymouth.*

What's Next?

Gather documentation for every generation from yourself through generation five. The Mayflower Society will supply information from the Mayflower Pilgrim through generation five. Consult the Florida Society of Mayflower Descendants Guidelines for more information.

Quality is Paramount!

The Mayflower Society requires high-resolution digital images or legible copier copies of government-issued births, marriages and any death certificates for the last three generations: you, your parents, and your grandparents. This includes <u>all</u> multiple spouses to ensure accuracy of lineages for future generations! If you use popular genealogy websites, make sure that you "download" the actual document. DO NOT print directly from online source, highlight, underline, or truncate documents!

Warning: not all documentation is created equal. Tiny footprints on hospital birth certificates may be precious family keepsakes, but they are not acceptable for genealogy purposes. The same thing applies to decorative church marriage licenses. Government-issued, long-form marriage licenses that include parent's names ensures lineage accuracy. Stay in Touch!

Take an active interest. Attend Colony meetings when possible and let the State Co-Historian or State Historian know how you are progressing from time to time. This way they can assist you in the areas where you may need help.
